The University of Melbourne fee policy for international students

This is the University's policy relating to the calculation and payment of tuition fees for commencing and continuing international students in 2011.

The tuition fees detailed in this publication relate to 2011 only. This policy applies to international students enrolled:

- > in an undergraduate, graduate coursework, or graduate research course (including Masters by Research, Doctoral and PhD candidates); or
- > in a Study Abroad course; or
- > in Community Access Program (CAP) subjects; or
- > who are studying 'onshore' or 'offshore'.

This policy does not apply to international students enrolled in courses offered by the Melbourne Business School or Melbourne Consulting and Custom Programs.

An international student:

- > is not an Australian citizen or permanent resident; and
- > does not hold a permanent Australian humanitarian visa; and
- > is not a New Zealand citizen.

If you are an Australian or New Zealand citizen, an Australian permanent resident, or if you hold a permanent Australian humanitarian visa, you should refer to the publication *Australian Student Tuition Fees 2011* available from the University Information Centre, Gate 3, Swanston Street or at:

All tuition and other fees are paid in Australian dollars (\$AUD).

Tuition fees do not include costs such as Overseas Student Health Cover and certain other costs.

CRICOS

Where the CRICOS code is shown as 'Pending' for a course listed in this document, the University is in the process of obtaining CRICOS accreditation for the course and anticipates enrolling international students from the start of the 2011 academic year. The course will only be available to international students if CRICOS accreditation is obtained.

Policy amendments

This fee policy takes effect for all students from 1 January 2011.

The University reserves the right to amend this policy as required. Any changes will be notified in writing.

Goods and Services Tax (GST) does not currently apply to tuition fees. Should this change, the University reserves the right to charge GST in addition to the published fee.



It is important that you read this policy before completing your administrative enrolment. Once you enrol, you will be bound by this fee policy and are agreeing to pay tuition fees for every year in which you are enrolled.

Frequently asked questions

What do the tuition fees cover?

Tuition fees cover the cost of tuition.

Tuition fees do not cover certain costs or services, for example:

- > Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). A separate fee is paid for this compulsory health insurance for international students.
- > Optional membership of the Student Union, Graduate Association or Melbourne University Sport (which provides access to the University's sports centre and other sports facilities). Students may nominate to join and pay a separate fee.

Students also have access to a range of free support services and facilities including:

- > Airport reception (within the limits outlined in the terms and conditions of the Airport reception service)
- > Programs such as Orientation
- > Services such as student housing and employment services.

Will my tuition fees ever differ from the published fee?

The tuition fees detailed in this publication relate to 2011 only.

These fees are subject to annual review and may be adjusted to take into account price and demand factors. The University provides a guarantee to international students who enrol that:

- > The tuition fee will not increase by more than 7 per cent per annum in any discipline for undergraduate subjects
- > The tuition fee will not increase by more than 10 per cent per annum in any discipline for graduate subjects
- > The tuition fee will not increase by more than 10 per cent per annum for students enrolled in a graduate course and paying a course-based fee.

These guarantees are not applicable to Study Abroad or Community Access Program subject fees.

When do I pay?

Tuition fee payments are made in advance of each study period. In 2011, you have three payment options: standard instalment; dual instalment or yearly instalment. Refer to 'Payment options in 2011' on page 22 for more information.

You will be sent an invoice for each fee instalment according to your enrolled study period. It is your responsibility to pay your fees and complete your enrolment by the published date; otherwise a late fee will be levied. If your fees remain unpaid, your enrolment will be cancelled and you will then need to reapply for admission to the course. You will remain liable for any outstanding debt. The University is required to advise the Department of Immigration and Citizenship of any cancellation of enrolment. This may lead to the cancellation of your student visa.

What if I commence in Semester 2?

If you are commencing your course in Semester 2, 2011, your fees for your first semester of study will be those applying in 2011. For the first semester of 2012, the fees you pay will be those approved for the 2012 academic year.

What if I defer my studies?

If you have an offer to study at the University in 2011 and you defer your studies until 2012, the fees you pay on commencement will be those set for 2012.

What if I transfer to a new course?

For undergraduate students transferring to a new undergraduate course, the fees you pay will be those set for the subjects into which you enrol at the time of transfer.

For graduate students transferring to a new graduate course, the fees you pay will be those set for the new course into which you enrol.

For Study Abroad students transferring to a new Study Abroad course, the fees you pay will be those set for the new course into which you enrol.

Students whose enrolment is terminated either for poor academic performance, disciplinary grounds or for failure to re-enrol in a timely fashion, if readmitted at any future time, will be required to pay fees according to the fee policy applicable at the time of readmission, not the policy that applied under their original enrolment. This also applies to students whose enrolment is terminated for unpaid fees or other outstanding debt and who are ineligible for reinstatement.

What happens if I change subjects within my course?

Subject fees: undergraduate courses and graduate enrolments with subject-based fees

Changing to subjects in different fee bands or changes to study load will result in a change to your fee liability (refer to 'Variations to fees owing' on page 23).

If the subject you add to your enrolment is charged at a higher rate than the one from which you withdraw, additional tuition fees will be payable. Alternatively if the subject you add to your enrolment is charged at a lower rate than the one from which you withdraw your subsequent semester's tuition fee will be credited or you may apply for a refund (refer to 'Refund policy' on page 24).

If you withdraw from a subject you must do so by the census date for that subject or you will be charged for the subject (refer to 'Variations to fees owing' on page 23).

Course fees: graduate enrolments with course-based fees

Your course tuition fee will only change if you change your study load (EFTSL). If you increase the number of subjects in which you are enrolled, or change to subjects of a higher weighting, your fee liability will increase. If you reduce the number of subjects in which you are enrolled or change to subjects of a lower weighting, you may decrease your fee liability and may be eligible for a refund, however you must have withdrawn from subject(s) by the subject census date or you will be charged for the original study load.

Course fees: Study Abroad

Undergraduate Study Abroad: Your course tuition fee will not change.

Graduate Study Abroad: Your course tuition fee will not change (unless you change to a majority of subjects within the other graduate band, resulting in a change of Study Abroad course).

If my tuition fees are paid on a subject basis, how do I know which discipline band applies to my subject?

Every subject at the University has been assigned to a discipline fee band. Details can be found in the Subject Fee Calculator: <http://fee.acs.unimelb.edu.au>

Subject fees are set within a fixed number of fee bands based on the Australian Government Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations discipline classification of the subject, with different prices charged for undergraduate subjects, graduate subjects and Community Access Program study. These discipline fee bands are determined by the content of the subject, not the course of which it forms a part, nor the faculty or school which is responsible for teaching it.

What if I am granted Australian permanent residency?

Australian Government requirements do not permit you to enrol or remain enrolled as an international student under these circumstances. You must advise the University immediately. Refer to 'International students granted Australian permanent residency', page 26 for more information.

What is a census date?

The census date for a subject is the last date that you can withdraw from that subject without incurring fee liability.

What is an EFTSL?

An EFTSL (Equivalent Full-Time Student Load) is a measure of study load. One EFTSL is equivalent to 100 credit points and represents a standard annual full-time load.

Undergraduate course tuition fees 2011

Applies to commencing and continuing undergraduate students

International students enrolling at the University of Melbourne in 2011 in an undergraduate course will pay tuition fees based on the particular subjects they choose to study. All undergraduate courses have subject-based fees.

Undergraduate subjects have been grouped into fee bands, with fees based on the cost of teaching the subjects and the demand for the discipline in which they fall. The discipline fee bands that have been set for international students in 2011 are detailed in Table 1. The fee bands in this table set out the basis for calculating your fees but do not necessarily represent a typical enrolment. The amount you are charged is the sum of the fees for all subjects in which you enrol.

Calculating your tuition fees

The fees shown in Table 1 are for each 100 credit points (1 EFTSL) that you undertake. 100 credit points is a standard full-time study load for one year of study. Each subject that you undertake has an EFTSL, or credit point value. Fees are charged based on the EFTSL value of the subject in each semester.

For example, if a subject is worth 12.5 credit points (0.125 EFTSL) then the fee charged for the subject is 0.125 multiplied by the \$/EFTSL fee for that subject. All year-long subjects are required to have their fees paid in full in Semester 1. For example, if a year-long subject is worth 37.5 credit points (0.375 EFTSL) then the fee is charged as 0.375 multiplied by the \$/EFTSL fee in Semester 1.

The total fees you will pay in any year are the sum of the subject fees for all subjects in which you are enrolled. For details of the EFTSL value and discipline of every subject at the University refer to the Subject Fee Calculator:

Example

Wei is an international student who enrolls in a Bachelor of Science in 2011. She enrolls in a total of 100 credit points (1 EFTSL), comprising 8 subjects:

- 4 science subjects (12.5 credit points each)
- 2 commerce subjects (12.5 credit points each)
- 2 maths subjects (12.5 credit points each)

Wei's tuition fees for 2011 are calculated as:

$$\begin{aligned} &(4 \times 0.125 \times \$31,200) + \\ &(2 \times 0.125 \times \$31,776) + \\ &(2 \times 0.125 \times \$29,408) \\ &= \$30,896 \end{aligned}$$

 If you would like an estimate of what your course tuition fees will be in 2011 refer to Table 2 for a schedule of typical course tuition fees for each undergraduate course available to students commencing in year 1 of the course. As far as possible, the fees provided in this schedule show the typical fees that a student enrolled in each course will pay for the first year of the course in 2011. However, these are indicative only and may vary depending on the number of subjects undertaken, their credit point value and the discipline band for each subject undertaken during your enrolment. If, for example, you complete a subject sequence in one year that is more than one EFTSL your fee liability will increase. For most courses the typical tuition fees are based on subject enrolments normally undertaken by students in the course, and reflect the discipline band of the subjects comprising the degree. For the New Generation degrees a typical fee range is shown, due to the wide range of variables that may affect the course structure, and subjects taken.

Graduate course tuition fees 2011

Graduate enrolments with course-based fees

Applies to all commencing graduate students in 2011^① and all continuing graduate students in 2011 who commenced a graduate course with course-based fees in 2010.

^①Excluding graduate students in Office for Environmental Programs courses.

International students enrolling at the University of Melbourne as a graduate enrolment with course-based fees in 2011 will pay tuition fees based on their course and study load. The tuition fees that have been set for each graduate course in 2011 are detailed in Table 3. The amount you are charged is the course fee listed per EFTSL enrolled. If you are studying more or less than one EFTSL in 2011, your fee will increase or decrease proportionally.

Calculating your tuition fees

Graduate coursework

The fees shown on pages 11–19 are for each 100 credit points (1 EFTSL) that you undertake. 100 credit points is a standard full-time study load for one year of study. Each subject that you undertake has an EFTSL, or credit point value. Fees are charged based on the total study load (EFTSL) you undertake in each semester.

For example, if you undertake 8 subjects worth 12.5 credit points each (0.125 EFTSL) your total study load for the year is 1 EFTSL (8x0.125). The fee charged for your study load is 1 multiplied by the \$/EFTSL fee for your course. If you undertake more or less than 1 EFTSL in a year the amount charged will increase or decrease correspondingly.

Example 1 (less than 1 EFTSL in a year)

Abhishek is an international student who enrolls in a Graduate Certificate in Arts in 2011. He enrolls in a total of 50 credit points (0.5 EFTSL) in Semester 1 and completes his degree.

Abhishek's tuition fees for 2011 are calculated as:

$$\begin{aligned} 0.5 \times \$23,104 \\ = \$11,552 \end{aligned}$$

Example 2 (1 EFTSL in a year)

Mohamed is an international student who enrolls in a Master of Management in 2011. He enrolls in a total of 100 credit points, 0.5 EFTSL in Semester 1 and 0.5 EFTSL in Semester 2.

Mohamed's tuition fees for 2011 are calculated as:

$$\begin{aligned} (0.5 \times \$30,208) + \\ (0.5 \times \$30,208) \\ = \$30,208 \end{aligned}$$

Example 3 (more than 1 EFTSL in a year)

Jasmina is an international student who enrolls in a Master of Teaching (Secondary) - Accelerated Mode in 2011.

She enrolls in a total of 75 credit points (0.75 EFTSL) in Semester 1 and 75 credit points (0.75 EFTSL) in Semester 2.

Jasmina's tuition fees for 2011 are calculated as:

$$\begin{aligned} (0.75 \times \$22,432) + \\ (0.75 \times \$22,432) \\ = \$33,648 \end{aligned}$$

Graduate research

The fees shown on pages 11–19 are for each 100 credit points (1 EFTSL) that you undertake. 100 credit points is a standard full-time study load for one year of study. Fees are charged based on the study load (EFTSL) you undertake in each semester.

Research semesters differ from coursework semesters in that Semester 1 is defined as 1 January to 30 June (six months) and Semester 2 is defined as 1 July to 31 December (six months). You will be charged on a daily pro rata basis per semester. For example, if you are a commencing research student who enrolls after a semester commencement date, your first semester fees will be adjusted to take account of the number of days you will actually be enrolled in that semester.

Example

Michelle is an international student who enrolls in a Master of Philosophy (Science). She starts her degree on 1 January with a study load of 0.5 EFTSL for Semester 1 and 0.5 EFTSL for Semester 2.

Michelle's tuition fees for 2011 are calculated as:

$$\begin{aligned} (0.5 \times \$30,048) + \\ (0.5 \times \$30,048) \\ = \$30,048 \end{aligned}$$

However, if Michelle did not commence until 20 March 2011, she would only be charged from 20 March 2011 for Semester 1. Her tuition fees would be adjusted to take account of the fact that her first semester will be only 103 days, not 181 days in duration. Her tuition fees for 2011 would be calculated as:

$$\begin{aligned} (0.5 \times 103/181 \$30,048) + \\ (0.5 \times \$30,048) \\ = \$23,573.57 \end{aligned}$$

International students enrolling at the University of Melbourne as a graduate enrolment with subject-based fees in 2011 will pay tuition fees based on the particular subjects they choose to study.

Graduate subjects have been grouped into fee bands, with fees based on the cost of teaching the subjects and the demand for the discipline in which they fall. The discipline fee bands that have been set for international students in 2011 are detailed in Table 4. The fee bands in this table set out the basis for calculating your fees but do not necessarily represent a typical enrolment. The amount you are charged is the sum of the fees for all subjects in which you enrol.

Calculating your tuition fees

The fees shown in Table 4 are for each 100 credit points (1 EFTSL) that you undertake. 100 credit points is a standard full-time study load for one year of study. Each subject that you undertake has an EFTSL, or credit point value. Fees are charged based on the EFTSL value of the subject in each semester.

For example, if a subject is worth 12.5 credit points (0.125 EFTSL) then the fee charged for the subject is 0.125 multiplied by the \$/EFTSL fee for that subject.

All year-long subjects are required to have their fees paid in full in Semester 1. For example, if a year-long subject is worth 37.5 credit points (0.375 EFTSL) then the fee is charged as 0.375 multiplied by the \$/EFTSL fee in Semester 1.

The total fees you will pay in any year are the sum of the subject fees for all subjects in which you are enrolled. For details of the EFTSL value and discipline of every subject at the University refer to the Subject Fee Calculator:

Example

Akiko is an international student who enrolls in a Master of Environment in 2011. She enrolls in a total of 100 credit points (1 EFTSL), comprising 8 subjects:

- 3 agriculture subjects (12.5 credit points each)
- 3 built environment subjects (12.5 credit points each)
- 1 education subject (12.5 credit points)
- 1 science subject (12.5 credit points)

Akiko's tuition fees for 2011 are calculated as:

$$\begin{aligned}
 &(3 \times 0.125 \times \$29,664) + \\
 &(3 \times 0.125 \times \$29,952) + \\
 &(1 \times 0.125 \times \$22,432) + \\
 &(1 \times 0.125 \times \$28,864) \\
 &= \$28,768
 \end{aligned}$$

Study Abroad course fees 2011

International students enrolling at the University of Melbourne in a Study Abroad course in 2011 will pay a tuition fee to the University of Melbourne. This is a set tuition fee for the program, irrespective of the number of subjects in which you are enrolled¹. The fee is the cost per semester enrolled. Semester 1, 2011 covers the period January to June 2011; Semester 2, 2011, July to December 2011.

¹These fees also apply to Australian students enrolling in a Study Abroad course at the University of Melbourne for credit to an overseas institution.

Calculating your tuition fees

The fees shown in Table 5 are the Study Abroad Tuition fees per semester. There is one set tuition fee per Study Abroad course.

Example

Alexander is an international student who enrolls in the undergraduate Study Abroad program. He enrolls for one semester in 2011.

Alexander's tuition fees for 2011 are calculated as:

$$(1 \times \$10,976) \\ = \$10,976$$

Tuition fees for students who commenced in 2004 or earlier

If you are an international student who commenced your course in 2004 or earlier, you are able to complete your study under the fee policy that applied at the time you commenced your course (known as 'grandfathering').

If you commenced your course prior to 2004 and remain on the grandfathered (original) fee policy this policy will apply only for:

- > Undergraduate courses: the standard duration of the course as defined when you commenced the course plus a further year; or
- > Graduate courses: twice the normal full-time duration of the course as defined when you commenced the course.

Any periods of leave of absence or part-time enrolment do not extend the above time frames.

If you take longer than the above time frames to complete the course you will be required to move to the current fee policy and must pay the fees applicable at that time.

If you transfer to another course you are subject to the current fee policy and must pay the fees applicable at the time of transfer.

If your enrolment is terminated either for poor academic performance, disciplinary grounds or for failure to re-enrol in a timely fashion, if readmitted at any future time, you will be required to pay fees according to the fee policy applicable at the time of readmission, not the policy that applied under your original enrolment. This also applies to students whose enrolment is terminated for unpaid fees or other outstanding debt and who are ineligible for reinstatement.

Tuition fee discounts in 2011

Tuition fee discount for University of Melbourne staff and their families

The University of Melbourne offers staff and their immediate families a 25 per cent discount on the tuition fees for graduate courses and Community Access Program subjects.

Discount on CAP/single subject study fees for alumni

University of Melbourne alumni who wish to enrol in an undergraduate subject through the Community Access Program are eligible for a discount of 20 per cent on the standard price (applies to subjects taken in both assessed and non-assessed mode). 2011 arrangements relating to the payment of fees

Payment options in 2011

When you enrol, you will be asked to select one of three instalment options for payment of your tuition fees:

- > **Standard instalment option**
One payment for the semester or study period cost (this is the default option)
- > **Dual instalment option**
The semester or study period cost is halved and payable in two equal instalments
- > **Yearly instalment option**
One payment for the cost of the full year in advance where the course duration is one year or longer. This option attracts a \$200 rebate.

The dual instalment option is not available for:

- > Study Abroad enrolments
- > Community Access Program enrolments.

Payment of instalments is required by the due date listed on your invoice (or if you enrol after the due date, within seven days of enrolment).

You normally use the same instalment option throughout a calendar year and can change your instalment option at the commencement of each new year.

All instalment options require at least one payment in advance of the commencement of classes. If your circumstances change significantly in a given year, you may contact Student Management Services – Enrolments to discuss payment options.

Year-long subjects

The full subject cost is incurred and payable in Semester 1. If you only enrol in year-long subjects you may wish to consider a dual instalment (two payments made in Semester 1).

Invoices

Commencing students

Your tuition and Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) fees will be detailed in your formal letter of offer and personalised acceptance agreement. You must submit a payment of \$AUD 10,000 and visa-length OSHC with the completed acceptance form by the date stated in the letter of offer to confirm your acceptance.

Undergraduate courses

For undergraduate students, since, at this stage, you have not chosen the subjects you wish to study, your formal letter of offer will state the estimated or typical 2011 undergraduate course fee. You must make a minimum deposit payment of \$AUD 10,000 to confirm acceptance of your offer.

Your actual tuition fee for 2011 can only be calculated after you have selected your subjects and may differ from the estimated or typical 2011 undergraduate course fee quoted in your formal letter of offer.

Once you have arrived and selected your subjects as part of enrolment, adjustments may need to be made to your fees owing. These adjustments will be based on your payment option and your actual enrolment.

On enrolment, you may therefore be required to pay an additional amount, or your deposit may have exceeded the amount required to cover your first payment. Any overpayment will be credited to future fee instalments.

If you have paid an assessment fee, this payment will be credited toward your first semester's fee account.

Graduate enrolments with a course-based fee

The fee quoted in your formal letter of offer is based on a standard full-time enrolment for Semester 1 and 2, 2011. Since, at this stage, you have not confirmed your total study load, your formal letter of offer will state the 2011 per EFTSL course fee (as listed on pages 11–19) with the Indicative total course fee also shown **1**.

You must make a minimum deposit payment of \$AUD 10,000 to confirm acceptance of your offer.

Your actual tuition fee for 2011 can only be calculated after you have confirmed your total study load as part of enrolment, and will be based on the 2011 per EFTSL course fee quoted in your formal letter of offer.

Once you have arrived and confirmed your study load as part of enrolment, adjustments may need to be made to your fees owing. These adjustments will be based on your payment option and your actual enrolment.

On enrolment, you may therefore be required to pay an additional amount, or your deposit may have exceeded the amount required to cover your first payment. Any overpayment will be credited to future fee instalments.

If you have paid an assessment fee, this payment will be credited toward your first semester's fee account.

1 Only the Indicative total course fee will be shown for graduate courses less than one year in duration.

Graduate enrolments with a subject-based fee (only for graduate students commencing in 2011 in a course offered by the Office for Environmental Programs)

Since, at this stage, you have not chosen the subjects you wish to study, your formal letter of offer will state the estimated or typical 2011 graduate course fee. You must make a minimum deposit payment of \$AUD 10,000 to confirm acceptance of your offer.

Your actual tuition fee for 2011 can only be calculated after you have selected your subjects and may differ from the estimated or typical graduate course fee quoted in your formal letter of offer.

Once you have arrived and selected your subjects as part of enrolment, adjustments may need to be made to your fees owing. These adjustments will be based on your payment option and your actual enrolment.

On enrolment, you may therefore be required to pay an additional amount, or your deposit may have exceeded the amount required to cover your first payment. Any overpayment will be credited to future fee instalments.

If you have paid an assessment fee, this payment will be credited toward your first semester's fee account.

Study Abroad courses

For Study Abroad students, your formal letter of offer will state the 2011 Study Abroad tuition fee per semester for your Study Abroad course. You must make a minimum deposit payment of \$AUD 10,000 to confirm acceptance of your offer.

If you have paid an assessment fee, this payment will be credited toward future fee instalments.

Continuing students

Your tuition fees will be charged based upon the fee policy in place in the year you commenced your course. The amount you will have to pay will be based upon the course and study load, or subjects you have re-enrolled in, your chosen payment option and any monies credited towards your account. Your invoice will be available online, via the Student Portal, prior to each due date.

For students paying by instalments, the due dates for instalments will be available via the Student Portal and advised on the online invoice.



It is your responsibility to ensure payments are made by the date specified on your invoice. If your fees remain unpaid, a late payment fee of \$100 will apply and you may be withdrawn from your subjects in the semester for which payment is outstanding, or have sanctions applied which restrict access to other services and facilities. Withdrawal means that your access to study materials and University facilities will be restricted. Your enrolment in your course will ultimately be cancelled if payment remains outstanding. Your enrolment may also be cancelled if you have other outstanding debts such as library fines or student loans. Cancellation means that your enrolment will lapse and you will not be able to use any facilities at the University. You will remain liable for any outstanding debt. The University is required to advise the Department of Immigration and Citizenship of any cancellation of enrolment. This may lead to the cancellation of your student visa.

If your enrolment has been cancelled for non-payment of fees and you wish to be reinstated to your course, you are required to apply for reinstatement to Student Management Services – Enrolments. A reinstatement fee of \$100 will apply, and payment of all outstanding fees will be required before reinstatement. Applications for reinstatement must be made in the same semester in which your enrolment was cancelled, otherwise the standard course application process applies.

If you anticipate a problem in meeting a fee payment deadline, please contact Student Management Services – Enrolments well before the deadline to discuss possible alternative arrangements.

Variations to fees owing

If you change subjects or study load after paying the first instalment for a semester, there may be a variation in your tuition fees owing for that semester. Any additional fees must be paid by the due date indicated on your online invoice. Any amount owing to you will be credited towards your next fee instalment or can be refunded on lodgement of a refund request. You should check your invoice via the Student Portal after changing subjects to verify if any additional tuition fees are due or have been credited.

Refund policy

This section sets out when the University is able to refund all or part of the tuition fees you have paid in advance to the University, how to apply for a refund and how they are paid.

When will the University refund your fees?

There are circumstances where the University is unable to provide a full or partial refund. Those circumstances are set out in the tables below:

1. You provide notice

	Notice given of subject withdrawal	Refund
1.1	By close of business on the census date ^❶ for the subject	A full refund of all the fees you have paid in advance for that subject. For international students in their first year of enrolment, any overseas representative's fee (normally 10 per cent of the annual tuition fees for the course accepted by the student) that has been paid will not be refunded. The maximum deduction will be \$250.
1.2	After the census date ^❶ for the subject	No refund will be given for subjects whose census dates that have passed.

2. Refund if University at fault

You will receive a full refund of all tuition fees you have paid in the following circumstances (except where you have already withdrawn):

	University default event	Refund entitlement
2.1	The course you have enrolled in does not start on the agreed starting date	Full refund of tuition fees payable within two weeks of the agreed starting date.
2.2	The course you are enrolled in ceases to be provided by the University at any time after it starts but before it is completed	Full refund of tuition fees payable within two weeks of the date on which the course ceased to be provided. Alternatively, you may be offered enrolment in another course offered by the University. You have the right to choose whether you would prefer a full refund of course fees or to accept the place offered in another course. You will be asked to sign a document to indicate that you have either accepted the refund or place in another course offered by the University.
2.3	The course is not provided to you in full because the University has a sanction imposed by a government regulator	Full refund of tuition fees payable within two weeks of the date on which the course ceases to be provided.

3. Refund if student at fault

You may not be entitled to a full refund of tuition fees if any of the following circumstances apply to you:

3.1	You fail to enrol to start the course on the agreed starting date and have not previously withdrawn or deferred	You will be refunded any course fees paid before the agreed starting day of the course (the default day) after we deduct at our discretion: (a) the lesser of: (i) an amount equal to 5% of the total amount of course money received before the default day; and (ii) \$250; and (b) any other amounts which the University is entitled to deduct under clause 29 of the <i>Education Services for Overseas Students Act 2000</i> . The University will provide you with a statement which sets out and explains the amounts that have been deducted.
3.2	The Australian Government authorities refuse to grant you a student visa	The University will refund all fees you have paid in advance within two weeks of receiving a request for refund if you have not been able to commence the course for this reason.
3.3	The University refuses to provide or continue to provide the course to you because you failed to pay an amount owing to the University in order to undertake the course	You will be entitled to a refund if the reason for the default is that you were refused a student visa. In which case, the University will refund any course fees you have paid before the date on which the University refuses to provide or continue to provide the course to you (the default day) after we deduct at our discretion: (a) the lesser of: (i) an amount equal to 5% of the total amount of course money received before the default day; and (ii) \$250; (b) the proportion of course money received before the default day that is equal to the proportion of the course that has been provided to you; and (c) any other amounts which the University is entitled to deduct under clause 29 of the <i>Education Services for Overseas Students Act 2000</i> . The University will provide you with a statement which sets out and explains the amounts that have been deducted.
3.4	The University refuses to provide or continue to provide the course to you because you breached a condition of your visa	You will not be refunded any tuition fees already paid for the semester in which you breached the condition of your visa or for previous semesters undertaken.

3.5 The University refuses to provide or continue to provide the course to you because you have been found to have engaged in misconduct (whether general or academic misconduct) and the University has suspended or terminated your enrolment	You will not be refunded any tuition fees already paid for the semester in which the suspension or termination has occurred or for previous semesters undertaken.
3.6 The University withdraws the offer of a place or terminates your enrolment because the information you gave the University was incorrect or incomplete	If this occurs during the first year of your study you will not be refunded the overseas representative's fee. The University also reserves the right to retain up to 10 per cent of tuition fees already paid where an offer is withdrawn because the Academic Registrar is satisfied that the offer was made on the basis of fraudulent documentation.
3.7 You are not making satisfactory academic progress and the University does not allow you to continue your course or your degree	You will not be refunded any tuition fees already paid for the semester in which the suspension occurred.

How to apply for a refund

How you apply for a refund varies depending on whether or not you have enrolled at the University:

1. Prior to enrolment	If you have not yet enrolled at the University, and decide to withdraw before the start of your first semester then you may apply directly to the International Admissions office for a refund of any fees that you have paid.

Payment of refunds

Special provisions for graduate completions

Adjustments after the submission of a thesis by graduate research students

Tuition fees will always be charged in advance. If you intend to submit a thesis before the end of a semester, you may be entitled to a refund depending on the date of submission. Once you submit your thesis any refund of fees will be calculated on a daily pro-rata basis. (See example calculation on right.)

Late submissions of a minor thesis by graduate coursework students

If a minor thesis is part of your work requirement for a given semester, you should submit this before the start of the next semester. If you are not able to do this then you must re-enrol in the same subject for the next semester and pay the tuition fees for this subject again. If you have completed the thesis and submitted it prior to the subject census date you can apply for a refund. If you do not complete and submit the thesis prior to the census date you are not eligible for a refund of fees.

Extension of research candidature

If you are a graduate research student who has been granted an extension of your candidature, you will continue to be charged fees for the next full payment period.

International students granted Australian permanent residency

If you have been granted Australian permanent residency before the start of your first semester or before you are fully enrolled (whichever is the earlier):

You must advise the University's General Manager, International Admissions immediately. Australian Government regulations do not permit you to enrol as an international student under these circumstances.

Your application will be reassessed to determine if you are eligible to receive a Commonwealth funded place at the University.

Undergraduate courses

If you have achieved the competitive academic standard for a Commonwealth supported place and there are Commonwealth supported places still available in the course, you will receive an offer for a Commonwealth supported place. If you do not satisfy the entry criteria for a Commonwealth supported place and/or there are no Commonwealth supported places remaining you will be unable to enrol at the University at that time. There are no Australian fee-paying places available for commencing undergraduate students in 2011.

Graduate coursework courses

If you have achieved the competitive academic standard for a Commonwealth supported place and there are Commonwealth supported places still available in the course, you will receive an offer for a Commonwealth supported place.

If you do not satisfy the entry criteria for a Commonwealth supported place and/or there are no Commonwealth supported places remaining you will be offered an Australian fee-paying place. The tuition fee will be as for all Australian fee-paying students commencing in the course in the year that you commence.

Graduate research courses

If you have achieved the competitive academic standard and Commonwealth Government Research Training Scheme places are available, you will receive an offer for an enrolment funded under the Commonwealth Government's Research Training Scheme.

If you do not satisfy the entry criteria for a Commonwealth Government Research Training Scheme place and/or there are no Commonwealth Government Research Training Scheme places remaining you will be offered an Australian fee-paying place. The tuition fee will be as for all Australian fee-paying students commencing in the course in the year that you commence.

Example

Raymond is an international student enrolled in a Doctor of Philosophy (Arts) in 2011. He is enrolled for Semester 2 from 1 July 2011 and is undertaking a normal study load of 0.5 EFTSL. Raymond's tuition fees for Semester 2 2011 are calculated as:

$$0.5 \times \$24,800 \\ = \$12,400$$

If Raymond submits his thesis on 13 September 2011 (before the end of semester), he would only be charged from 1 July to 12 September 2011. His tuition fees would be adjusted to take account of the fact that Semester 2 will be only 74 days, not 184 days in duration. His actual tuition fees for Semester 2 are calculated as:

$$0.5 \times 74/184 \times \$24,800 \\ = \$4,986.96$$

He is entitled to a refund of \$7,413.04 (\$12,400 – \$4,986.96)

If you have been granted Australian permanent residency after enrolling as an international student:

You must immediately contact your Student Centre and present your passport. Australian Government regulations do not permit you to stay enrolled as an international student under these circumstances.

Your enrolment will be converted to an Australian fee-place in the same course, where available. If your enrolment is converted to an Australian fee-place, the tuition fee will be as for all students commencing in the course in the year of the transfer.

Students in undergraduate and graduate coursework courses will also be eligible to apply for a Commonwealth supported place (CSP) where available.

Your application for a Commonwealth supported place will be considered along with all other transfer or lateral entry applicants.

Selection into any available places will be determined on academic merit. If you are not successful in gaining a Commonwealth supported place at the time of application, you can reapply for a CSP for the following semester.

Admission to Commonwealth supported places is highly competitive and a transfer into a CSP may not be possible.

To apply for a Commonwealth supported place:

- > If permanent residency is granted before the closing date for CSP applications for the next intake period for your course
 - > Apply for a Commonwealth supported place using the standard method for your intake, go to www.futurestudents.unimelb.edu.au/apply
- > If you are granted permanent residency after the closing date for CSP applications for the next intake period for your course
 - > Apply for a Commonwealth supported place in writing to the Manager of the Student Centre administering your course. Your application must be made before the subject census date. If Commonwealth supported places are still available you will be considered for one.

Graduate research students who gain Australian permanent residency may be eligible for their course enrolment to be funded under the Commonwealth Government's Research Training Scheme in subsequent semesters. Once you have presented your passport showing your Australian permanent resident status, your enrolment will be converted to a Research Training Scheme place, where available, in the subsequent semester.

Fees and refunds for international students granted Australian permanent residency

If your enrolment is converted from an international fee-place to an Australian fee-place or Commonwealth supported place, any changes to enrolment and fees will take effect from the first census date after you notified the University of your change in citizenship. If your tuition fees are less than the amount you have paid for that and any subsequent semester, the difference will be credited to your account. For international students in their first year of enrolment, any overseas representative's fee (normally ten per cent of the annual tuition fees for the course accepted by the student) that has been paid will not be refunded. The maximum deduction will be \$250. Should your tuition fees be higher you will be issued an invoice for the difference.

If you are granted Australian permanent residency during a semester but after your final subject census date in that semester, the international fee will continue to apply for that semester. Your new fee structure will apply from the following semester.
